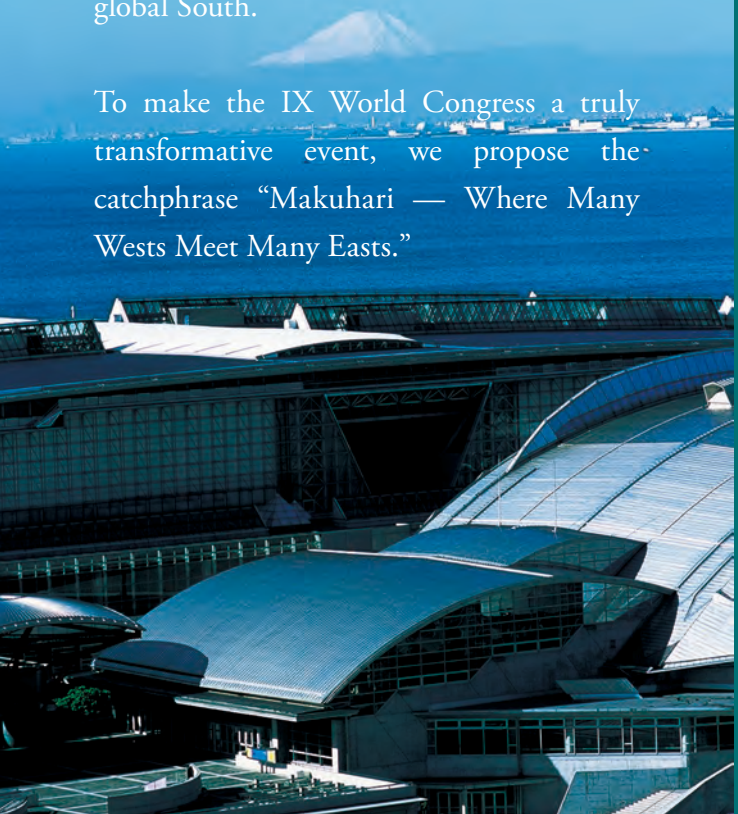

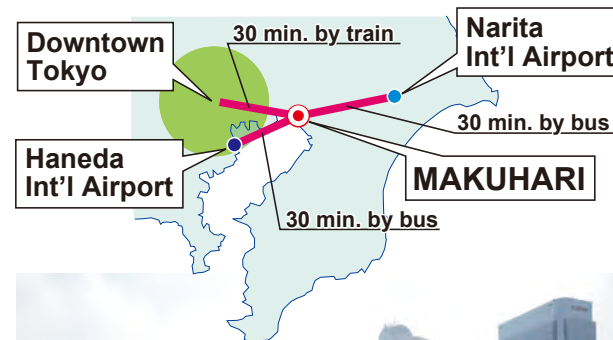

(International Council for Central and East European Studies) was created in 1974 to promote what were then called Soviet and East European Studies. A World Congress, held once every five years, is its main mission.

The congress brings together 1500 – 2000 researchers to encourage scholarly interaction via the dissemination of 1200 research papers presented at 400 different panels. In addition, there will be a number of thematic lectures and seminars, as well as a book exhibition. Publishers from many countries will be represented.
