

Guideline for Proposals:

1. The Organizing Committee accepts proposals for panels, roundtables, and individual papers starting November 21, 2013. The deadline for submissions is May 31, 2014. The Academic Committee will inform proposers of the status of their proposals by August 2014.
2. All proposals need to be scholarly in nature. Only proposals approved by the Academic Committee of the Congress will be included in the program.
3. The official languages of the Congress are English, Russian, French, and German.
4. The language for administration, such as proposals and CV, is English.
5. Panels/papers will be divided into the following categories:
 - Anthropology/Ethnology;
 - Arts/Film/Electronic Media;
 - Border Studies/Transregional Comparison;
 - Economics;
 - Education;
 - Geography;
 - Gender Studies;
 - History;
 - International Relations/Conflict Studies;
 - Jewish Studies;
 - Jurisprudence;
 - Language Pedagogy/Professional Development;
 - Library/Information Sciences;
 - Linguistics;
 - Literature;
 - Philosophy/Thought;
 - Politics;
 - Public Administration/Social Welfare;
 - Religion Studies;
 - Sociology;
 - Interdisciplinary Panels
 - Others ;
6. The allocated time for a panel will be one and a half hours.
7. Being an organizer of a panel or roundtable does not count as being a “participant.” You may organize as many panels/roundtables as you wish. Yet an organizer should intermediate all communications between the panelists and the Organizing and

Academic Committees.

8. You may assume up to four different roles during the Congress: presenting a paper, chairing a panel or a roundtable, being a discussant, and participating in a roundtable. Each of these roles may be performed only once, and there can only be one form of participation in any panel or roundtable.

9. A panel involves a chair, three paper presenters, and at least one discussant, with a maximum of two. A round table involves a chair, and a minimum of four to a maximum of five participants.

10. You may propose the same paper individually and as a participant of a panel. Yet if the Academic Committee confirms the panel proposal to which you belong, your individual proposal will automatically be invalidated.

11. A panel has to be international in its composition. A panel comprising of participants from a single nation will not be accepted.

12. If you agree to participate in the ICCEES World Convention in 2015, you are agreeing to be scheduled during any of the planned sessions. We will honor specific scheduling requests only for religious reasons.
