Dear Brothers in Islam! Assalam Alaikum wa Rahmatu-llah wa Barakatuh

- ② [And the THUNDER uttereth his praise, and the Angels also, for awe of Him: and he sendeth his bolts and smiteth with

them whom he will while they are wrangling about God ! Mighty is he in prowess.]

(3) [To Allah submits whosoever is in the heavens and in the earth willingly or unwillingly, and likewise do their shadows in the mornings and the evenings.] {Sura 13, Ayat 16(Fluegel 15)} (Trans. by M.Z.Khan)

In Islamic thought, all creatures in heaven and earth praise God. How on earth do they praise? For instance, the birds praise God extending their wings! Every one knows his own prayer and his own praise.

Not only all creatures in heaven and earth, but also the THU NDER utters his own praise! Yes, even SHADOWS submit to Allah! (I clearly remember reciting this Ayat for the first time and being deeply moved to tears.)

The essence of all created things consits in praising Allah and submitting to Allah. In that essential point, human beings a -nd other creatures (including even thunder and shadows) are all brothers and sisters one another; man praising and submitting o -n the ground with his shadow in his own manner, birds praising and submitting in the sky in their own manners, thunder praising and submitting in the sky again in his own manner, and fishes p -raising and submitting in the water in their own manners.

As long as the birds in Islamic lands parise Allah flying an -d extending their wings, then, why not the birds in Japan? Is there any difference between your birds and ours? As long as the thunder in Islamic lands utters his praise, why not the thun -der in Japan? Is there any difference between your thunder an -d ours? As long as the shadows in Islamic lands submit to All -ah in the mornings and the evenings, why not the shadows in Japan? Is there any difference between your shadows and ours? Verily Islam is universal. As long as you find the Islamic pheno -mena in your lands, we must find exactly the same Islamic pheno -mena in ours.

Yes, Islam is not heterogeneous for us Japanese at all. In o-ther words, Islamic universality itself never consider Japanese religious sentiment to be heterogeneous. As long as Islam is un-iversal, it must hold true in Japanese religious heart.
