Again reorganized and renamed in 1888 as the Regio Istituto Orientale di Napoli. Instruction expanded to include the languages of Asia, Africa, and Europe between 1903-1913. In 1925, upon further reorganization, it was accorded the rank of a superior institution of learning as the Regio Istituto Superiore Orientale di Napoli (1937). The present name was adopted under the education law of 1957.
